

# Report Card Grading Policy

## ➤ Level 1

- Student is not proficient at grade level material.
- Student will require intense academic intervention services to meet promotional criteria and move on to the next grade.

## ➤ Level 2

- Student has some understanding of the grade level material.
- Student may have mastered parts of the curriculum, but he or she is lacking understanding of a significant portion of the curriculum.
- Some academic intervention services will be required to meet promotional criteria and move on to the next grade.

## ➤ Level 3

- Students are proficient at grade level material.
- Students are expected to meet promotional criteria and move on to the next grade without additional services.

## ➤ Level 4

- Students have consistently excelled at grade level material.
- Parents can be confident that their child will meet or exceed promotional criteria.

### Grading Policy for Chapter Tests

Teachers will divide the number of points received for correct answers by the total number of possible points on the exam. That answer will be multiplied by 100. This will give the teachers the percent of questions answered correctly. The following Percent-Grade level correlation table is provided for your reference.

<b>% Correct Answers</b>	<b>Grade Level</b>
96% - 100%	4
80% - 95%	3
65% - 79%	2
Less than 65%	1

### How will I know if my child is approaching a level 4 as a report card grade?

Teachers will use multiple assessment measures that include, but are not limited to:

- Tests
- Homework
- In-class discussions/class participation
- Projects/Math Tasks
- Writing assignments
- Written classroom activities

It will be necessary for a child to receive a 4 on the majority of all assessment measures to receive a 4 on the report card. For more information about the specific progress of your child please speak to your child's teacher directly.
